

Advent Week 2: PFACE



"Shalom", the most common word

for peace in the Old Testament, means more than the absence of war. The concept of Shalom also includes wholeness, well-being, security, salvation, and flourishing. What better way to celebrate the birth of the Prince of Peace than to foster the well-being of someone in whose life peace is lacking.

The second Advent candle, the Bethlehem Candle, signifies Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem and reminds us of the peace Jesus brings to the world. In our communities there are those without shalom because of illness, financial hardships, addictions, crime, abuse, loneliness, and a host of other problems. Be sensitive to the signs of distress among those we encounter this Advent. Honor Christ by choosing to be a peacemaker. As we seek to bring peace to those around us, we may experience God's gift of peace for us!

Mary found peace with her pregnancy by accepting her circumstances and submitting to God's will because of her deep faith in God.

Advent Reflection:

Consider practical ways to cultivate peace in your life. Acts of kindness, moments of stillness, and intentional times of prayer can flow into our hearts and spill over to the lives of those around us.
