A dvent Week 3: JOY

Mary visited her cousin, Elizabeth, to show her support and proclaim her JOY at being

chosen to be the mother of Jesus. She traveled roughly one hundred miles on a donkey. Biblical scholars believe she stayed for three months, likely being present for the birth of John the Baptist.

Mary's trip demonstrates the call to be community. Sometimes our physical presence is the best gift we can give another person. However, it is we that often receive much in return.

The third Advent candle, the Shepherd's Candle, represents the JOY that filled the hearts of all who received the news of Jesus' birth from the angels.

How are you keeping your focus on Christ in the midst of this hectic season?

Why are you doing what you are doing - choosing this gift, sending

Christmas cards, attending this party...?

How did you sow JOY in this time when hatred, fear, and busyness is the norm?


