A dvent Week 4: Love



The fourth Advent candle, the

Angel Candle, symbolizes love and reminds us of the angels' message of "Peace on Earth, good will toward men" and our call to love one another.

The Christmas story is all about LOVE: Joseph's love for Mary; Mary's love for Jesus; God's love for us; and our love for one another.

We know Joseph loved Mary because of his response when she told him she was with child during their engagement. He chose the way of love, to divorce her quietly, protecting her from a great amount of shame and attention. We know Mary loved Jesus, tenderly wrapping Him in swaddling clothes and laying him in a manger. She treasured hearing that the shepherds were spreading the good news of His birth. We know God loves us. God, the Father, sent His Son into the world to save the world through Him. Since God so loved us, we also should love one another. And so, Christmas is not only a reminder of how much God loves you, but also how much you should love other people.
