New York State's Catholic Bishops have voiced their opposition to Proposal One known as the Equal Rights Amendment. Bishop Matano calls it "a wolf in sheep's clothing", and strongly urges Catholics to vote against it. "The title suggests a noble cause, as all children of God should be treated equally under law. However, this proposed amendment to the state Constitution is broadly written and could have dangerous consequences if enacted, which is why we oppose it and urge you to vote No," the Bishops wrote.

According to the bishops, the broad language used in the amendment includes age as a protected class, which could cause parents rights to be stripped away and, if approved, the amendment would permanently legalize abortion without restriction up until the moment of birth in New York.

"Morning Has Broken" followed by prayers and readings.


