Next anointing will be in October. Date to be determined.




New York State's Catholic Bishops have voiced their opposition to Proposal One known as the Equal Rights Amendment. Bishop Matano calls it "a wolf in sheep's clothing", urging Catholics to vote against it. "The title suggests a noble cause, as all children of God should be treated equally under law. However this proposed amendment to state Constitution is broadly written and could have dangerous consequences if enacted, which is why we oppose it and urge you to vote no," the bishops wrote.

According to the bishops, the broad language used in the amendment includes age as a protected class, which could cause parents rights to be stripped away and, if approved, the amendment would permanently legalize abortion without restriction up until the moment of birth in New York.

Why is our parish conducting a census? The purpose is to gather precise and current data on all registered parishioners to strengthen pastoral care, stewardship, and communication efforts.

Do I still need to complete the census if my information has not changed? Yes. Everyone is asked to participate in the census to ensure that our database is up-to-date and accurate.

How will my information be utilized or managed? All information will be handled with the utmost confidentiality. The data collected will be used solely for pastoral, stewardship, and communication purposes.

I have already completed the census form online, do I still need to fill out an in-pew census card? Yes. There is a place on the census card to indicate that you have already completed the form online.
